### Care You Can Count On

When Eric Opel and his wife, Caroll, moved to Kamloops from the United States in June of 2024, they were excited for a new adventure. For Caroll, this was a homecoming. She had secured a director role at Royal Inland Hospital, a place she held close to her heart. This was not only the hospital where she was born but also where she initially trained as a nurse, jump-starting her highly rewarding career. Little did Caroll and Eric know that life-changing events were about to unfold within the walls of this hospital, giving them a profound appreciation for Canadian healthcare and the team of medical professionals who were about to touch their lives in ways they could never have imagined.

On October 16th, 2024, Eric's day started like any other. But as the hours passed, he felt increasing discomfort in his stomach, accompanied by intense sweating. By evening, he seemed to be improving until suddenly, he collapsed. Caroll's nursing instincts took over, and she jumped into action, assessing his condition while their daughters, Deore and Lia, called 911.

Paramedics arrived within minutes and quickly recognized the urgency of the situation. Eric's blood pressure was dangerously low, and he was slipping in and out of consciousness. A computed tomography (CT) scan revealed that he had suffered a ruptured mesenteric pseudoaneurysm, resulting in life-threatening internal bleeding within his abdominal cavity. The only chance of saving him was to stop the bleeding and get him into emergency surgery as soon as possible.

The nurses and staff in the Teck Emergency Department worked tirelessly, administering blood transfusions and stabilizing him for transport. Within hours, Eric was airlifted to Vancouver General Hospital, with Caroll by his side. Waiting ambulances rushed him straight into surgery, where specialists worked to repair the rupture and save his life. The procedure was a success, but Eric's journey was far from over.

Over the next 37 days, he faced one challenge after another, including: complications from surgery, a battle with COVID-induced pneumonia, and even a pulmonary embolism. Through it all, he never faced it alone. The compassionate and highly skilled teams at Vancouver General Hospital and Royal Inland Hospital stood by him and his family every step of the way.

After 10 days in Vancouver, Eric was strong enough to return to Kamloops, where he continued his recovery at



short of extraordinary. In addition to expert medical treatment, Eric's care team took a family-centric approach, ensuring that Caroll was involved in every decision. When she couldn't be at his bedside, Dr. Brar, Eric's hospitalist, would even FaceTime her to keep her updated. Nurses, medical students, and support staff all went above and beyond in the delivery of his care. During a difficult night when Eric was experiencing anxiety, a nurse offered to do her charting by his bedside so she could stay with him, providing comfort and reassurance.

During their time in hospital, Caroll and Eric truly came to appreciate the strength of Canada's healthcare system. Having spent years navigating the complexities of an insurance-driven model in the United States, they saw firsthand how care in Canada is delivered with compassion, without hesitation, and without financial barriers.

The day Eric was discharged was unforgettable. As he and Caroll walked out of 6 south, the staff who had diligently

cared for him during his recovery gathered to cheer them on as they departed.

With each passing day, Eric grows stronger, and his family's gratitude deepens. Looking back, Caroll knows there is no way to truly express the depth of their appreciation. "We hear so much about the challenges in healthcare, but I have seen the best of it. When you walk into Royal Inland Hospital needing help, you will get it. We are here today because of the remarkable people who saved Eric's life."

### Coming Together for Cancer Care: Colombo Lodge Reaches \$100,000 Fundraising Goal

For over a century, the Italian Cultural Centre, Colombo Lodge, has been a vital part of our community. Since 1914, this volunteer-driven group has dedicated itself to giving back, raising over \$4 million to support local charities, educational scholarships, and relief efforts both near and far through their *Colombo Cares* initiative.

In 2019, they made a bold five-year commitment to the RIH Foundation to raise \$100,000 in support of local cancer care. With cancer touching the lives of so many, including members of the Lodge, this was a deeply personal choice. Their goal was to bring the community together through an annual Spring Fling Banquet but



just as they were preparing to launch their first event, the pandemic hit.

Instead of putting their plans on hold, they leaned into their community spirit. Volunteers prepared and delivered takeout meals to 2,000 healthcare workers and first responders in Kamloops, a sincere gesture of kindness during an uncertain time. They also kickstarted their fundraising through creative drive-thru dinners, raising \$5,000 in the early days. As in-person gatherings returned,



the first Spring Fling Banquet made its debut in 2023, quickly becoming one of Kamloops' most anticipated annual events. The first two years brought in an impressive \$55,000. With excitement at an all time high, the sold-out event on April 26th, 2025, reached new heights. The evening raised an astounding \$40,000, bringing their total to \$100,000 and fulfilling their pledge in full!

There are no words to express how much the RIH Foundation appreciates the Colombo Lodge for their resource-



fulness, generosity, and community leadership. You've created a cherished event that brings people together and leaves lasting memories. More than that, you've given our community the chance to be part of something deeply meaningful. Your impact will be felt for years to come.

On June 13th, 2025, the RIH Foundation, together with Ronald McDonald House BC and Yukon and Interior Health, proudly opened the Ronald McDonald Family Room at Royal Inland Hospital: a space dedicated to keeping families close during some of life's most difficult moments.

This long-held dream only exists thanks to an extraordinary \$1 million gift from Rae Nixon, given in memory of her husband Dr. Lloyd Nixon, a beloved Kamloops physician who cared for three generations of local families. Inspired by her own childhood experience of being hospitalized alone, Rae dreamed of creating a safe, welcoming place where no child would feel scared, and no family would feel far from their loved one.

Located just steps from the Rita C. Mercier Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, Art & Norma James Pediatric Department, and the Evening Auxiliary to the RIH Obstetrical Services Unit, this 1,100-square-foot space offers:



- > A comfortable living room for rest and connection
- > A fully equipped kitchen and dining space





- > In-house washer and dryer
- > A play area for young patients and siblings
- > A quiet space for reflection or private conversations

# How Monthly Giving Helps Bring Specialized Care to Kamloops

When Kristina and Daniel Grondzil became monthly donors to the Royal Inland Hospital Foundation in 2018, they were guided by a simple truth: healthcare touches everyone. Having been born and raised in Kamloops, and now raising their two children here, they believed that supporting our local hospital was one of the most meaningful ways to care for their community. They had no way of knowing that years later, one of their children would need access to a pediatric neurologist and that their monthly contributions would help bring that care closer to home.

Like many other parents, Kristina and Daniel's world changed when their child received an unexpected diagnosis. Thankfully they had been referred to Dr. Breanna Clive, a pediatrician at RIH who became a pivotal figure in their care journey. She not only helped the Grondzils find answers but also went above and beyond to connect them with specialists across the province. These appointments meant travelling to Vernon, Kelowna and even Vancouver, often on short notice. With another child at home and full-time jobs, the need to travel outside of Kamloops added stress to a time that was already overwhelming and filled with uncertainty and endless questions.



The Grondzils explain, "Dr. Glass addressed so many of our unanswered questions. He listened with such empathy and explained things in a way no one else had. We genuinely felt heard and understood. We are truly thankful to him for taking time from his practice in the Lower Mainland, allowing us and many other families to access

needed care without having to leave Kamloops."

Dr. Glass, now runs an outreach clinic here in the Art & Norma James Pediatric Department at RIH. He plans to come 3-4 times a year, seeing as many patients as possible during each visit. From newborns to teens, his work spans a wide range of neurological conditions—from seizures, migraines, and brain injuries to developmental delays, neuromuscular disorders, and more. Dr. Glass also offers virtual follow-up appointments from his office in Burnaby, ensuring continuity of care for the children he sees in Kamloops. For families like the Grondzils, this hybrid model has been transformative.

When the opportunity arose to bring Dr. Glass to Kamloops, the RIH Foundation said yes immediately. We were able to do that thanks to the generosity of donors like the Grondzils. Monthly giving provides a dependable stream of funding that empowers the Foundation to respond quickly when new opportunities emerge, whether it's investing in lifesaving equipment, funding innovative programs, or helping gain access to specialists like Dr. Glass. The RIH Foundation has proudly supported every aspect of making this outreach clinic a reality, helping to fund Dr. Glass' travel costs, expenses while visiting, and even administrative support. This behind-the-scenes investment ensures that when Dr. Glass arrives in Kamloops, he can focus entirely on what matters most: providing expert, compassionate care to children and families in our community.

"Kamloops has an excellent adult neurology group, but there was a clear gap in pediatric neurology," Dr. Glass shares. "I knew families were travelling far to see me at my clinic in Burnaby. Being able to simplify that and offer care in their community means everything to me. It's one less burden for families already carrying a lot. With family ties in the nearby rural community of Williams Lake, and a love for the outdoors, the opportunity felt like a perfect fit.

"I am honoured to be part of helping to improve access to care here," says Dr. Glass. "Thank you to the generous donors of the RIH Foundation for making this possible."





# A Gift Given With the Belief That Everyone Deserves to Heal



Ted and Maryanne Kowalsky have spent a lifetime building, with their hands, their hearts, and their values.

After moving from a small town in Saskatchewan to Kamloops in 1979, the Kowalskys worked hard to create a better life for their family, eventually building the highly respected custom cabinetry business, 7 Point Millworks & Installations. Grounded in the values of hard work, community spirit, and giving back, they never forgot where they came from or what it took to get where they are today.

Ted and Maryanne are the proud parents of two children, Lanette, a faculty member in the School of Nursing at Thompson Rivers University and Bryce, a volunteer medical first responder for St. John's Ambulance. Bryce was born with serious health complications that led to more than 20 surgeries before the age of 35. Each surgery brought a long, challenging road to recovery, spending countless hours in rehabilitation, first as a child learning to walk again and later as an adult determined to live a full independent life.

Royal Inland Hospital (RIH) and its rehabilitation team became a constant: a place of reassurance, hope and healing.

With deep gratitude for the care Bryce received, Ted and Maryanne made a remarkable donation of more than \$200,000 to the RIH Foundation in support of rehabilitation medicine over the past few years, a gift that has changed the landscape of care for countless others in our region.

Their gift helped fund the development of a physical medicine & ambulatory care clinic (PMACC), assist with upgrades to the rehabilitation department and help purchase many vital pieces of equipment necessary to deliver rehabilitation medicine.

The impact of their generosity is undeniable. "Their generosity allowed us to establish a true outpatient physical medicine and ambulatory care clinic—something we didn't have before," says Dr. Budiman-Steinley, Physiatrist at RIH. "It integrates care and allows me to work side-by-side with therapists. Without their support, we wouldn't have the equipment, the training environment, or the credibility to uphold RIH's status as a tertiary hospital."

Just recently, Dr. Budiman-Steinley presented Ted and Maryanne with a wish-list of equipment their department could only dream of acquiring this year. That dream has now become a reality because Ted and Maryanne have committed another \$100,000 to purchase every item on that list.

The Royal Inland Hospital Foundation has named both this rehabilitation clinic and a rehab patient room on the 7th floor of the Phil and Jennie Gaglardi Tower in honour of the Kowalsky's extraordinary gift. This is a lasting tribute to a family whose gift continues to restore mobility, dignity, and quality of life for so many.

Bryce, former volunteer and employee of New Life Mission and now an employee of *Happy Day Senior Services* and devoted volunteer with *St. John Ambulance*, is the living embodiment of that impact.

### REMEMBERING JOE BUTLER

# **Never Forgetting** Where He Started and **Never Failing to Help Anyone in Need**

Joe Butler never forgot where he came from and never stopped helping others get to where they needed to be.

Born in Rexton, New Brunswick, in 1939, Joe grew up with humble roots, one of many siblings in a household that knew hardship intimately. He often shared vivid stories of collecting bottles as a boy or the rare excitement of finding a full tube of baloney in the fridge. "We were just like the kids in Angela's Ashes," he would say. Those early experiences didn't harden him; they shaped him into a man who led with compassion, integrity, and understanding.

Joe's path took him to Ottawa, where he mastered his automotive skills and became the ultimate "car man." Eventually, he moved to Kamloops, where he met the love of his life, June. In 1975, with only two cars and a shared dream, Joe and June opened Butler Auto & RV Centre, a business built on quality, trust, and old-fashioned hard work. Over the decades, their business grew into a cornerstone of our community, while Joe and June's humility always stayed the same. Whether it was helping someone start their own business or quietly offering a hand to those struggling, Joe and June never hesitated to give back.

Joe may have had a gruff, no-nonsense exterior, but inside was a gigantic, gentle heart. When their son Glen was faced with cardiac complications, Joe and June were deeply moved by the care he received at Royal Inland Hospital. In 2017, they gave \$200,000 to support cardiac care, determined to ensure that other families could access the same level of life-saving support close to home. Another meaningful project was the Butler Community Garden on the Northshore where anyone could come and enjoy fresh organic vegetables. These gifts were made from a place of deep gratitude and love for their community.

In his final days, Joe found himself relying on the care of his family physician, Dr. Lawrie, and the incredible staff at Royal Inland Hospital and Kamloops Hospice. This time, his family was on the receiving end of the compassion he had spent a lifetime offering to others. Surrounded by the people he loved, Joe passed peacefully on June 27th, 2025.

Joe's legacy is more than a generous donation or a successful business. It's in the countless lives he quietly changed,

the deep and enduring love he shared with June, and the belief that no matter where you come from, you can always make a difference. The RIH Foundation is honoured to carry forward his spirit through the care his gifts continue to provide.
